Participant Summary

Background and objective

The Australia, New Zealand, and Asia Pacific School Library Survey, conducted by Softlink on behalf of the school library sector, examines key trends and issues impacting school libraries. Points for analysis include annual school library budgets and staffing levels, as well as the use of digital resources in school libraries, school library services, trends, and other key factors important to school libraries. The results help to advocate the role of school libraries and library professionals to education decision makers, as well as through industry associations and networks.

This participant summary provides a statistical benchmark and overview for Tasmania. Further analysis of statistics and trends will be explored in the full 2020 Australia, New Zealand, and Asia Pacific School Library Survey Report, which will be available in early 2021.

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Overview of TAS Participants

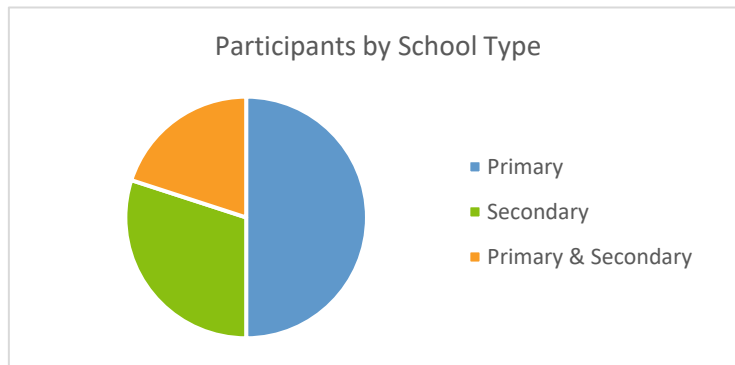
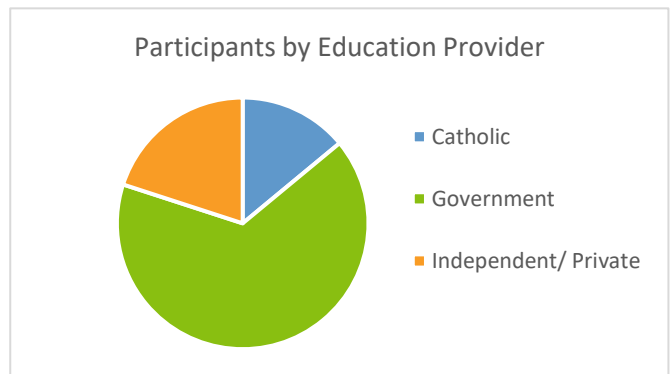
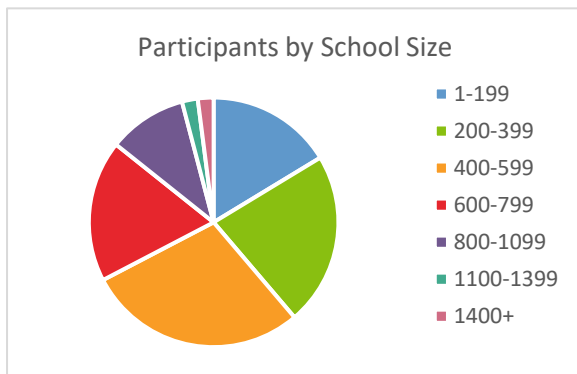


Participant breakdown

The 2020 Softlink School Library Survey for the Australia, New Zealand, and Asia Pacific regions was released August 28 and closed September 30. Invitations to participate were extended to all schools in the region via email, Twitter, LinkedIn, OZTL_Net, and promoted by a number of our partners, associates, and school library groups.

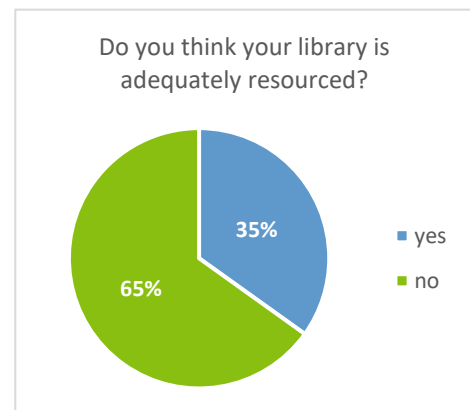
We had our highest ever response rate to date, with 2103 participants from 9 countries. 50 Tasmanian schools participated which, according to data obtained from the [My School website](#), represents 19% of TAS schools.

The breakdown of schools by size, education provider, and school type can be seen in the charts below.



Is your school library adequately resourced?

When asked if they thought their library was adequately resourced (including budget and staffing) 35% of TAS respondents said “yes”, while 65% said “no”.

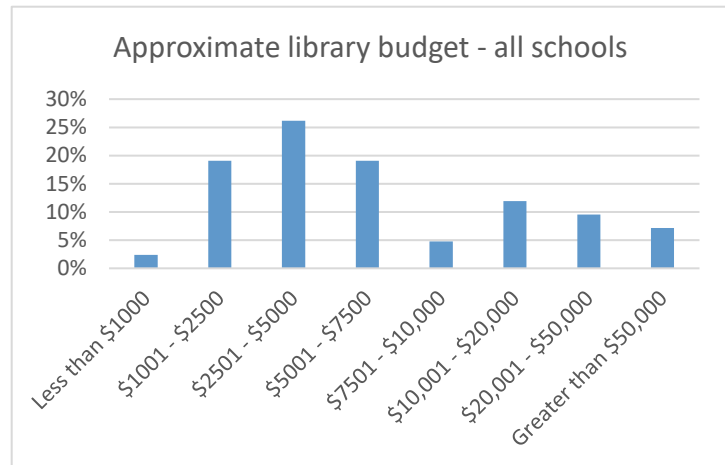




Approximate library budget all schools

When looking at reported budgets for all schools in TAS, the highest percentage of respondents (26%) reported a budget in \$2501 - \$5000 range.

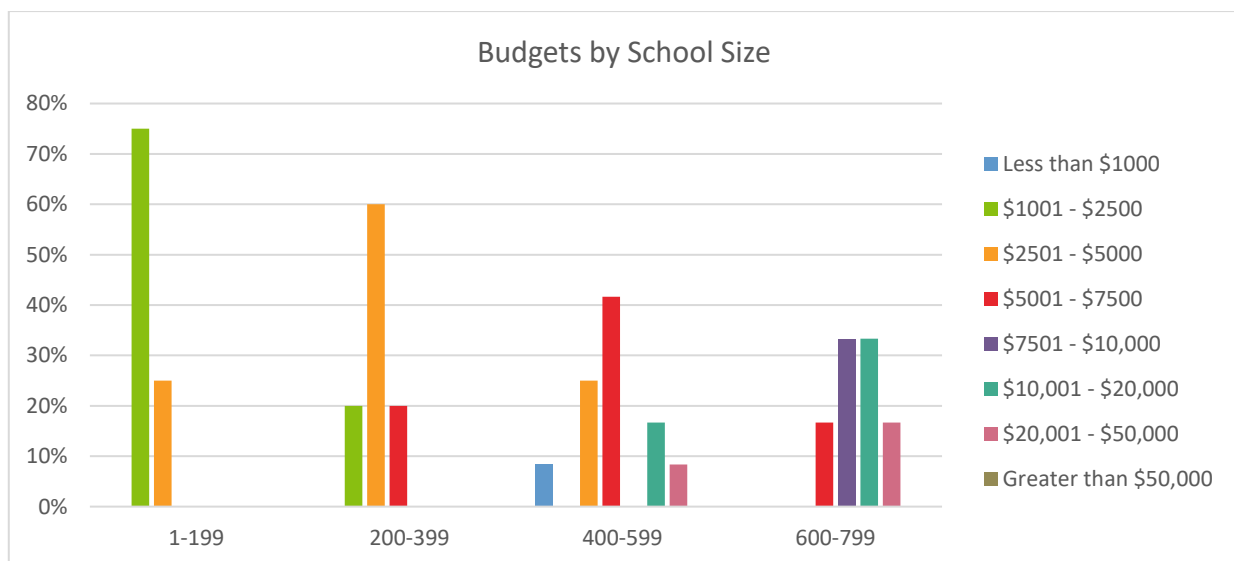

Budgets by school size

When looking at library budgets by school size, the highest percentage of TAS respondents reported the following budget ranges:

| School Size | Percentage | Budget range |
|-------------|------------|---------------------|
| 1-199 | 75% | \$1001 - \$2500 |
| 200-399 | 60% | \$2501 - \$5000 |
| 400 - 599 | 42% | \$5001 - \$7500 |
| 600 - 799 | 33% | \$7501 - \$10,000 |
| | 33% | \$10,001 - \$20,000 |

Budgets by education provider

When looking at budgets by education provider, the reported budget range that had the highest percentage of TAS respondents is as follows:

Catholic:

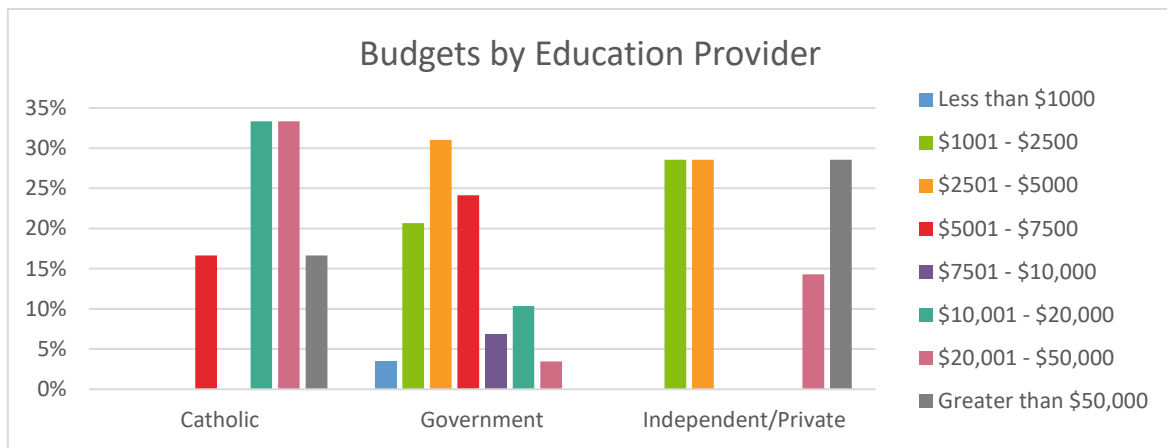
- \$10,001-\$20,000 – 33%
- \$20,001-\$50,000 – 33%

Government

- \$2501-\$5000 – 31%

Independent/Private:

- \$1001-\$2500 – 29%
- \$2501-\$5000 – 29%
- Greater than \$50,000 – 29%



Budgets by school type

When looking at budgets by school type, the reported budget range that had the highest percentage of TAS respondents is as follows:

Primary/Contributing:

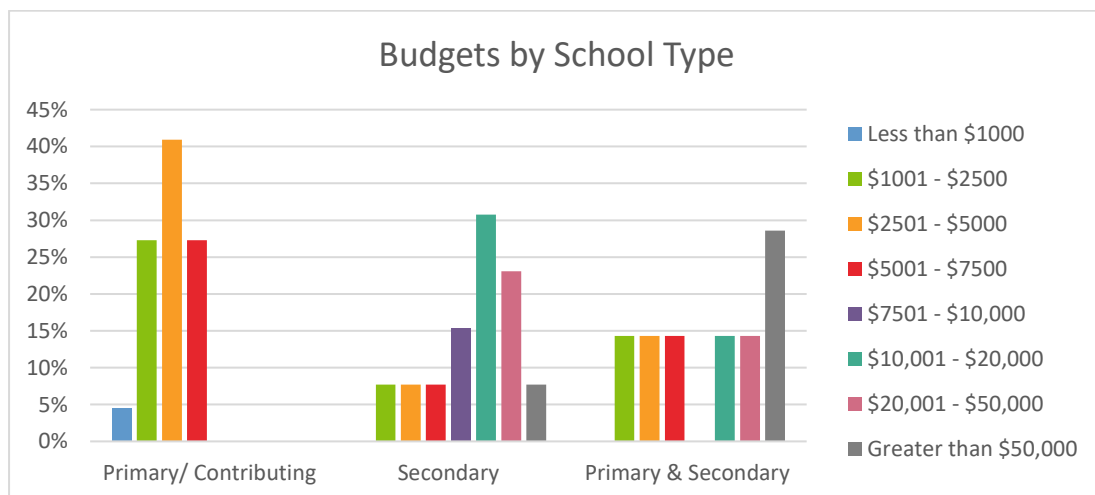
- \$2501 - \$5000 – 41%

Secondary

- \$10,001 - \$20,000 – 31%

Primary & Secondary

- Greater than \$50,000 – 29%



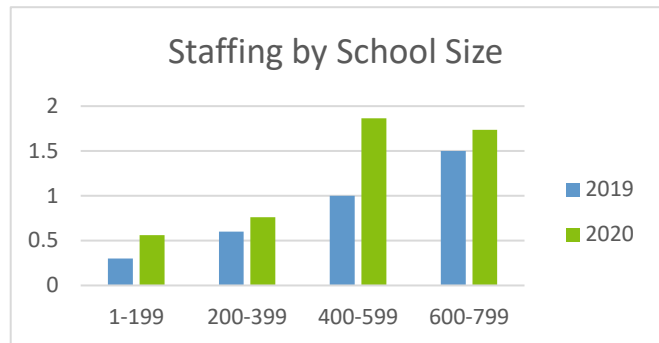


Staffing by school size

When looking at TAS school library staffing by school size, the reported staffing average comparison for 2019 and 2020 is as follows:

| School Size | 2019 | 2020 |
|-------------|------|------|
| 1-199 | 0.3 | 0.6 |
| 200 - 399 | 0.6 | 0.8 |
| 400 - 599 | 1 | 1.9 |
| 600 - 799 | 1.5 | 1.7 |

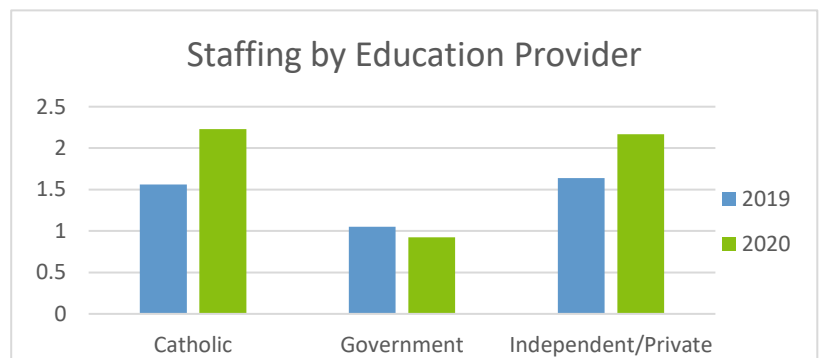

When looking at TAS school library staffing by education provider, the reported staffing average comparison for 2019 and 2020 is as follows:

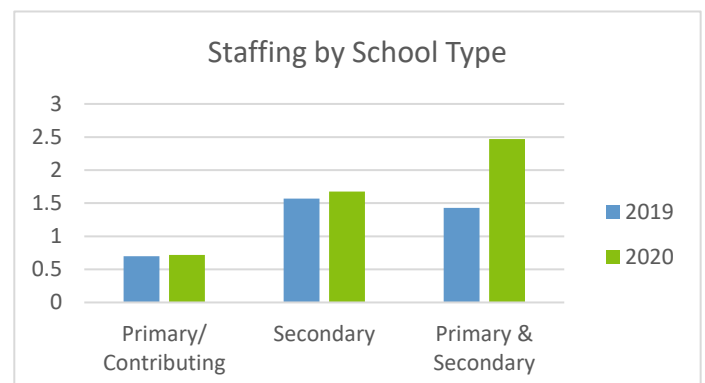
| Provider | 2019 | 2020 |
|-------------|------|------|
| Catholic | 1.6 | 2.2 |
| Government | 1.1 | 0.9 |
| Independent | 1.6 | 2.2 |



Staffing by school type

When looking at TAS school library staffing by school type, the reported staffing average comparison for 2019 and 2020 is as follows:

| School Type | 2019 | 2020 |
|----------------------|------|------|
| Primary/Contributing | 0.7 | 0.7 |
| Secondary | 1.6 | 1.7 |
| Primary & Secondary | 1.4 | 2.5 |



Support and engagement

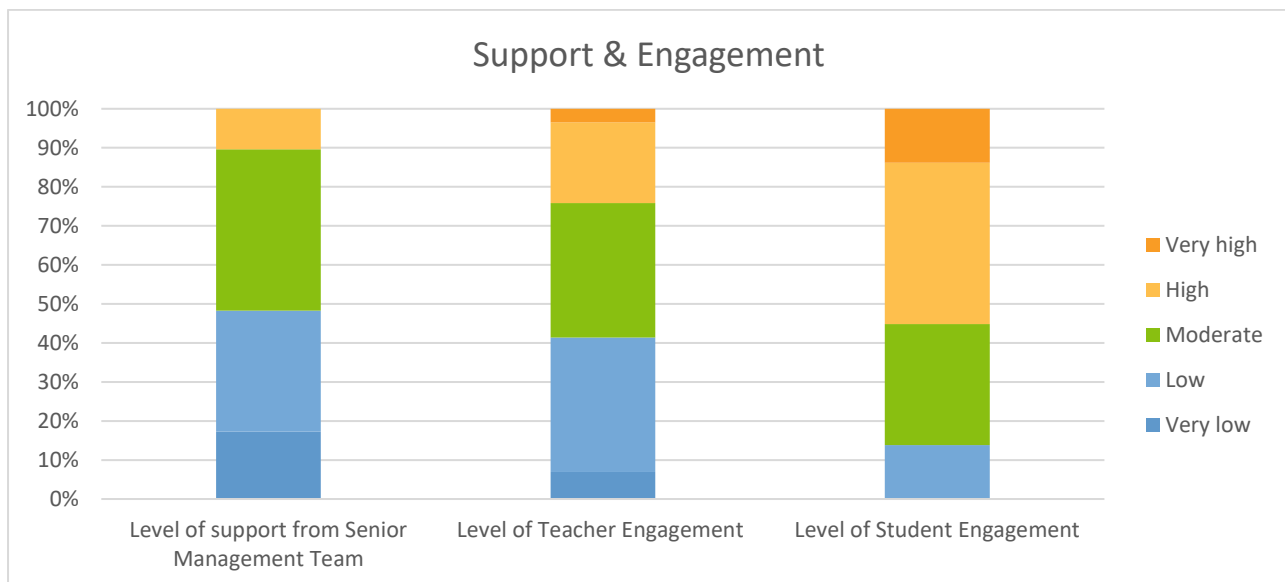


Level of support and engagement

Participants were asked about the level of support they receive from the Senior Management Team and the level of teacher and student engagement with the library.

The percentages of TAS respondents for categories ranging from “very low” to “very high” are as follows:

| | Level of Support from the Senior Management Team | Level of Teacher Engagement with the Library | Level of Student Engagement with the Library |
|-----------|--|--|--|
| Very low | 17% | 7% | 0% |
| Low | 31% | 34% | 14% |
| Moderate | 41% | 34% | 31% |
| High | 10% | 21% | 41% |
| Very High | 0% | 3% | 14% |
